Strategic Report for the Year Ended 31 March 2017

The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 31 March 2017.

#### REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

For the year ended 31 March 2017 the Company made a net profit of £ 2,767,550.

The Company is the London operating entity for Prime Focus World N.V. Group. The Prime Focus World N.V. Group consolidated the Visual Effects services with Double negative Limited, a London based Visual Effects Services Company by acquiring its 100% stake in July 2014. Post-acquisition Company has carried out planned restructuring activities to benefit from synergies of two businesses. During the year, Company has focused on Animation and Stereo conversion business for Hollywood features films, which has benefited in 100% revenue increase compared to previous year.

#### RISK REVIEW

The Company has established a risk management framework for ensuring that the major risks facing the Company are identified, evaluated and actively managed. Risks are reviewed continuously. It is not possible to mitigate fully all risks to which the Company is exposed but the ability to manage such risks is a key consideration of the Company.

#### FOREIGN EXCHANGE

The company sometimes enters into significant contracts that are denominated in US dollars. However, these contracts are serviced by costs denominated in UK Sterling. The Company is therefore exposed to US dollar/ UK Sterling exchange rate fluctuations. Management monitors foreign exchange markets to assess this exposure but currently does not undertake and hedging activity to mitigate this exposure. The foreign exchange impact in the current financial period was not material.

#### ABILITY TO ATTRACT AND RETAIN QUALIFIED PERSONNEL

Attracting, training, retaining and motivating technical and management personnel, including individuals with significant technical expertise, is a critical component of the future success of our business. The departure of any of our core members of our creative and technical teams could have a negative impact on our customer relations and operations, including our ability to provide and maintain the service levels our customers expect, which turn could have an adverse effect on our business.

#### **CUSTOMER RELATIONSHIPS**

According to Box Office Mojo, the six major Hollywood motion picture studios (Paramount, Warner Bros., Columbia, Walt Disney, Universal and Twentieth Century Fox) accounted for approximately 85% of US domestic box office revenue. These studios are key customers for the company and to the extent our relationship with any of these Companies, or their key executives, deteriorates our business could be adversely affected.

#### QUALITY AND REPUTATION

Our business depends on maintaining and strengthening our reputation for providing services that meet and exceed customer expectations in the markets we serve. If we fail to maintain the quality of our services or fail to promote our brand and reputation successfully our business could be adversely affected.

#### GOING CONCERN

The directors having reviewed the company's forecasts, and the support assured by the Parent Company, Prime Focus World N.V., are confident that the company has adequate financial resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The directors have therefore continued to adopt the going concern basis in preparing these financial statements.

The Principal activities of the Company are the provision of comprehensive creative and technical services to the film industry' primarily focusing on Animation and Stereo conversion.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards including Financial Reporting Standards 102 the Financial Reporting Standard Applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the company.

The Significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

#### 1.2 Going Concern

At the balance sheet date the company had net assets of £ 369,279 and net current liabilities of £ 963,431. The Board of Directors has received assurance from the holding company Prime Focus World N.V. that it will continue to support the company for the foreseeable future. Accordingly the Board of Directors considers that it is appropriate that the company's financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis. Hence, these financial statements are prepared assuming the company will remain a going concern.

As per the audited accounts for the year ended 31 March 2017, the Prime Focus World N.V. group, (of which Prime Focus International Services Limited is a member), made a pre-tax profit from operations of approximately \$ 14.7 mn and at the balance sheet date had an accumulated profit of approximately \$ 0.2 mn. The revenue as per the audited group accounts for the period ended 31 March 2017 has improved and the directors of the group are confident that this will continue during 2018. The Group continues to manage its cash position through a combination of effective working capital management, corporate loans and support from its ultimate holding company, Prime Focus Limited.

The company and the Group is subject to risks and challenges similar to other entities in the same stage of development of its product and services. These risk include, but are not limited to, dependence on key individuals, successful development, marketing and branding of new products and services, the ability to obtain adequate financing to support growth, and competition from larger companies with greater financial, technical, management and marketing resources.

In the next twelve months the Group will continue to face significant risks associated with the successful execution of its strategy. These risks include, but are not limited to changes in the marketplace and retention of key personnel. However, the Board of Directors considers that it is appropriate that the company's financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis.

#### 1.3 Cash flow statement

The company, being a subsidiary undertaking of the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS 102.

#### 1.4 Related party exemption

The company is wholly owned subsidiary of Prime Focus Limited, the consolidated accounts of which are publicly available. Accordingly, the company has taken advantage of the exemption in Section 33 of FRS 102 from disclosing transactions with Prime Focus Limited and its wholly owned subsidiaries.

#### 1.5 Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amount receivable for services provided during the period, exclusive of Value Added Tax. Revenue is recognised on work carried out on film projects during the year.

Where a contract is not completed at the period end, the amount of revenue recognized in the period is based on a percentage of completion of the project. The percentage of completion of the project is based on the number of man days required to complete the project as this provides the most accurate estimation of the percentage of completion at the period end. Where losses in respect long term contracts are expected and can be reliably measured they are provided for within the profit and loss account.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

#### 1.6 Goodwill

Goodwill is carried at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses. Goodwill is amortised on a straight line basis over 5 years.

#### 1.7 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Leasehold improvements

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

Straight line over the life of lease

Straight line over 3 to 7 years

In case of early termination of lease, the balance carrying value of the asset is charged as depreciation in the year of termination.

#### 1.8 Impairment

The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/ external factors. An impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use.

#### 1.9 Deferred tax

Deferred taxation is recognized in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, or a right to receive repayments of tax.

Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent that the directors consider it more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted. Deferred tax assets and liabilities have not been discounted.

#### 1.10 Foreign currencies

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the rates of exchange ruling at the dates of the transactions, or at the average rate for the period if the rates do not fluctuate significantly. Monetary assets and liabilities are translated at the period and exchange rate or, where appropriate, at rates of exchange fixed under the terms of the relevant transaction. The resulting exchange rate differences are charged to the profit and loss account.

### 1.11 Leasing

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalized as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charges allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

Rentals payable under operating lease are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### 1.12 Pensions

The Company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions are recognized in the profit and loss account in the period in which they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.

#### 1.13 Provisions

A provision is recognized when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.
